IMPORTANT.—This certificate must be preserved with care and delivered intact (*i.e.*, without separating Parts B and C) to the person effecting the burial, etc., of the body, as to whom, **SEE ON BACK.**
The PENALTY for failing to deliver it is 40s. The burial, etc., of the body may be stopped if this certificate is not so delivered.
If it is intended to remove the body out of England and Wales for disposal, notice must be given to the Coroner in advance of the intended removal. A form for giving notice may be obtained from the Registrar giving this certificate.
If the Death has not already been registered it must be registered within 14 days of the date on which it took place by a relative of the deceased or one of the persons required by law to give information for the purpose. The Registrar attends at.....
